





New Security Requirements From the U.S. Government (ACAS)

Ensuring compliance with Air Cargo Advance Screening (ACAS) requirements is essential for maintaining the security and efficiency of air cargo operations. ACAS enhances supply chain protection by requiring advance electronic data submission for risk assessment before cargo is loaded onto aircraft bound for the United States. However, compliance can present challenges, including data accuracy, integration with existing logistics systems, and potential delays in cargo clearance. This panel will explore the critical role of ACAS in air cargo security, the common obstacles in meeting its requirements, and strategies to ensure seamless compliance while maintaining operational efficiency.
