Excursions in Nairobi

About 10Km drive out of Nairobi Central Business District is Nairobi National Park, the world's only wildlife capital that plays host to a wide variety of wildlife, birdlife, and the best scenic views from the park and beyond. Wide open grass plains and backdrop of the city scrapers, scattered acacia bush play host to a wide variety of wildlife including the endangered black rhino, lions, leopards, cheetahs, hyenas, buffaloes, giraffes, and diverse birdlife with over 400 species recorded.

Animal Orphanage

Nairobi Animal Orphanage is a wildlife rehabilitation centre in Nairobi National Park. It is the oldest of its kind in Kenya. Hyenas, leopards and scarce Sokoke cats are some wildlife that can be found here. Various birds can also be viewed, including parrots, guinea fowls, crowned cranes, and ostriches. It provides a conservation facility for animals to return to optimum health after injuries and abandonment to return to the wild. Nairobi Animal Orphanage also acts as an educational centre for the public, who can get up close and personal with over 20 different animal and bird species

Giraffe Centre

The Giraffe Centre is located in Langata, approximately 20 kilometres from the centre of Nairobi, Kenya. It was established in order to protect the vulnerable giraffe, that are found only in the grasslands of East Africa. The African Fund for Endangered Wildlife Giraffe Centre - locally referred to as The Giraffe Centre - plays a pivotal role in conserving the critically endangered Rothschild giraffe (which differ from other giraffe subspecies as they have no patterning below the knee). From the raised wooden structure (giraffe height), you can watch the giraffes up-close, and hand feed them. You may also observe warthogs snuffling at their hooves, scavenging on the fallen pellets

David Sheldrick Wildlife Trust

The Sheldrick Wildlife Trust (SWT) operates one of the most successful orphan elephant rescue and rehabilitation program in the world. The Sheldrick Wildlife Trust raises orphaned baby elephants and integrates them back in the wild. The trust is a leader in conservation efforts to help save the remaining African elephant populations in grave danger from the illegal ivory trade. The Sheldrick Wildlife Trust's Elephant Orphanage is located in Nairobi National Park and is open to the public for one hour every day.

Nairobi National Museum & Snake Park

The museum features both temporary and permanent galleries that attract learners and tourists. Its permanent exhibits include the Cradle of Humankind, showcasing early man and Stone Age tools, and the Story of Mammals, which explores evolution, locomotion, feeding adaptations, and defense mechanisms. The Bird's Gallery highlights East Africa's diverse bird species, while the History of Kenya gallery traces the country's communities, language groups, colonial history, and independence. Other exhibits include the Cycles of Life, Numismatic, and Asian African Heritage galleries, offering a rich exploration of culture, history, and biodiversity.

The museum features both temporary and permanent exhibits. The Nairobi Snake Park, established in 1961 at the Nairobi National Museum, serves as a research center and sanctuary for rescued and threatened reptiles. It features venomous and non-venomous snakes, crocodiles, tortoises, turtles, and lizards, with an American alligator donated in 1967 as a key attraction. The park promotes awareness of endangered species, provides recreation, and functions as a research and training hub for reptile conservation.



Karen Blixen Museum

Located in Nairobi's serene suburb, the Karen Blixen Museum offers insight into the life of Danish author Karen Blixen and a tranquil space for reflection against the backdrop of the Ngong Hills. Once the centerpiece of a farm owned by Blixen and her husband, the museum gained international fame after the Oscar-winning film *Out of Africa*, based on her autobiography. Visitors can explore the historic house, a lush garden, indigenous forest, and outdoor exhibits featuring period farm tools, a coffee processing factory, and a vintage tractor. The museum also has a shop with souvenirs and books, while educational programs cater to children and school groups.

Bomas of Kenya

Bomas of Kenya is a tourist village in Langata, Nairobi. Bomas interpreted to mean (homesteads) displays traditional villages belonging to the several Kenyan tribes. Bomas of Kenya is home to one of the largest auditoriums in Africa.

It is located approximately 10km from the Central Business District. It is also a famous tourist attraction in Kenya. The word Bomas comes from a Swahili word “Boma” meaning coal house a subsidiary company of Kenya Tourist Development Corporation as a tourist attraction. It also wanted to preserve, maintain, and promote rich and diverse cultural values of various tribal groups of Kenya

Amboseli Safari

ITINERARY



Day One: Depart Nairobi to Amboseli National Park

0800hrs: Pick up from a central point in town for the morning drive to Amboseli National Park located at the foot of snowcapped Mt.

Kilimanjaro, Africa's highest peak. Arrive in time for lunch at Amboseli Serena Lodge

1300hrs - 1430hrs: Lunch at the Lodge

1430hrs: Check into the rooms and rest for about 1hour before an afternoon game drive is provided.

1600hrs: An Afternoon game drive will be provided. (Animals expected to be seen here include; large herds of elephant, wildebeest, zebra, Thomson's gazelle amongst others)

Dinner and overnight in Amboseli.

Day Two: Full day in Amboseli with Morning and Afternoon Game drives

0630hrs: Depart for a Morning game drive in search of herds of elephant, wildebeest, zebra, Thomson's gazelle amongst others

0830hrs - 0930hrs: Return back to the Lodge for breakfast.

1000hrs - 1200hrs: Time spent at the hotel relaxing or swimming

1230hrs - 1400hrs: Lunch at the Lodge

1400hrs - 1530hrs: Rest of the afternoon at Leisure to relax or swim at the Camp

1600hrs: An Afternoon game drive will be provided. (Animals expected to be seen here include; large herds of elephant, wildebeest, zebra, Thomson's gazelle amongst others)

Dinner and overnight in Amboseli.

Day Three: Depart Amboseli back to Nairobi

0730hrs – 0900hrs: Breakfast at the Lodge
